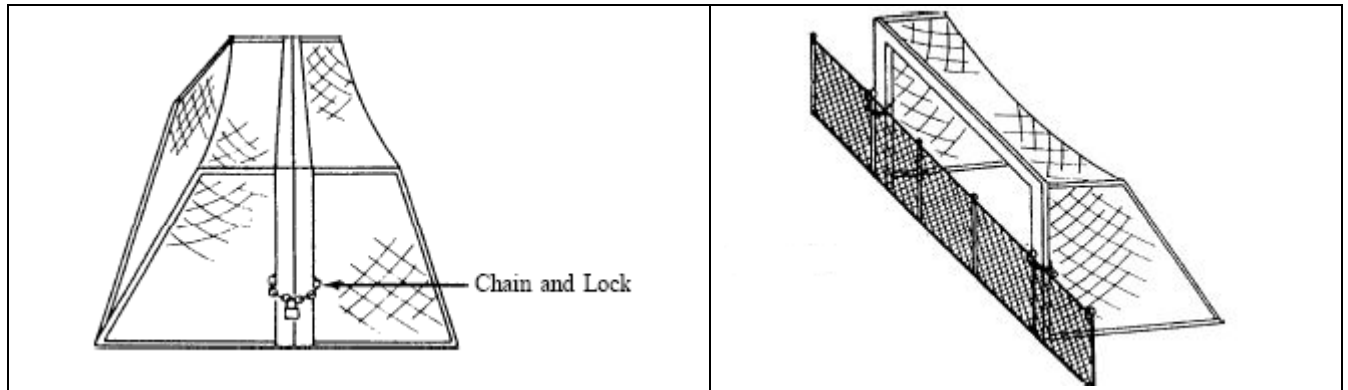


# Instruction for Storing Goals and Corner Flags

## Why Goals Must be Locked

According to CYSA-N, accidents related to the goals accounts for the largest percentage of insurance claims. Goal related accidents does not happen just during the games. All teams must make sure that the goals are stored properly after each practice. Goals must be stored to minimize the possibility of some one playing with them. They need to be stored in either of the following ways.



Goals must be stored upright. Putting the goals face down could break the joints and increase the potential for accidents.



**After you unlock the goals for use, lock back the chain and lock, so they do not disappear when you come back to lock the goals. Lock the storage box, too.**

## EDS U12+ Goals



Four Roll-on Goals are stored between Fields 3 and 4. Place the goals, so they are not easily visible from the street (Doyle Ave.). Also, when locking the goals, make sure the chain is wrapped tight around the post, to prevent the goals from being moved.



One or more set of assembled Fold-a-Goal are locked to the fence along the track field (Field 4).  
Goals are locked together and to the fence.



Storage box, containing corner flags and stakes, is secured to the fence, behind the cargo containers.  
When locking the box, slide the knob on the door bottom down.



## EDS U10 Goals

U10 goals are stored behind the backstop by the school building on Easterbrook side.



The goals should be locked together face-to-face with locks **on both posts**, so they cannot be used. **One of the lock should be used to secure the goals to the backstop.**



Storage box is secured to the new building on the south side of the field. The storage box contains stakes for U10 goals and corner flags for U8 and U10 fields. Corner flags are in two pieces. There are stakes and a hammer for U10 goals. **To secure U10 goals, use the stakes. Sand bags are for U8 goals.**



## EDS U8 Goals

There are total of three sets of U8 goals locked to the fences by the South entrance of the Marilla parking lot.



Storage box is secured to the new building on the south side of the field. The storage box contains corner flags for U8 and U10 fields. Corner flags are in two pieces. **To secure U8 goals for the game, use the sand bags.**



## Moreland

There are two sets of goals at Moreland. Roll-on goals are locked to the fence along Campbell Ave., and the other set is locked to the baseball fence.



The storage box is secured to the fence along Castro Drive.

When locking box, make sure the handle is in the LATCHED position and push the padlock in. Otherwise the box is not locked, even if you push the padlock in.



## Coventry

There are two sets of goals at Coventry. One set is behind the backstop near Colleen Way and other is by the north fence.



Goals behind the backstop are locked face to face and to the backstop, so they cannot be opened up. Goals by the fence is also locked face to face and to the fence.



## Strawberry

Goals at Strawberry Park is locked to the fence along the parking lot.
